There used to be a song entitled 'No one Loves a Fairy when she's Forty', and a very sad ditty it was. People often wonder what athletes do when they are no longer athletic. Well, the well-known champion wrestlers from Rushden, the Joyce Brothers, Ken and Doug, have not waited until they finish wrestling, but have established themselves already with a go-ahead tyre business, the Orbit Tyre Company, in their native Rushden. Already, they have a branch at Weymouth, and others will be opened in due course. They have other business interests, too, but their Orbit Tyre Co. is the one that we are interested in, because it is the donor of the "Northamptonshire Trophy", for which a number of famous Senior drivers will be competing on September 1st, our next meeting.

### ANSWER TO CORRESPONDENT

Somebody sent me half a letter recently, asking me why we no longer ran 'mixed' meetings at which both Senior and Junior cars competed, and this letter was going on to say that he (I presume it was a 'he') wanted to know why . . . and then it stopped. There was probably another page to this letter, but I didn't receive it, so I don't know who wrote it.

The answer to the question about mixed meetings is simple.


When 'Junior' racing first started, there were not many cars about. It was then possible to encourage what runners there were by putting ten or twelve cars out, and using a reasonable amount of money to make a bit of interest for those drivers. Since then, however, there have been so many Junior cars built, and so many new drivers have appeared, that they have 'got organised'. They insisted on a minimum rate per car, which priced them right out of the reckoning.

The answer then, is that neither we, nor any other promoter, can put on a mixed meeting which shows both classes of car at their best. If there are enough seniors, then there isn't enough money for a strong field of juniors, and vice versa.

The only proper mixed meeting, with both classes decently represented was our Easter Monday meeting, which was actually two full meetings in one. It was not an economic success, but the eight-race programme, which lasted three and a half hours, was the biggest meeting in the history of the sport. Nobody else is likely to try to emulate it, we are quite sure, so the record will probably stand in the annals of Stock Car racing.
